

### Trail to Bay Challenge

A community program that mobilizes urban families to explore the outdoors. In partnership with the City of Chula Vista and with support from the California State Parks Habitat Conservation Fund, participants are encouraged to explore, learn, and protect wildlife. By attending three hikes and one cleanup, participants receive a Family Four Pack to the Living Coast!

Our first offsite hike post-pandemic, at Morrison Pond, had a record attendance of 46 participants, showing just how much our community appreciates and needs this safe, outdoor social and recreational event.

**84%** percent of event waste was diverted from the landfill, with a total of **186** pounds of material recycled or composted.

The Living Coast is proud to be part of Team Clapper Rail, composed of organizations dedicated to the study, restoration, and introduction of the Light-footed Ridgway's Rail (Rallus obsoletus levipe) in Southern California. The Light-footed Ridgway's rail is a state and federally-listed endangered species. The presence of the rail within a coastal habitat indicates a functioning tidal salt marsh ecosystem and its rich biological diversity. Team Clapper Rail aims to support the rail population through collaborative efforts in zoological propagation, field research, annual census, monitoring, banding, genetic sampling, and introductions into the wild throughout the region.






